Two Senior Lecturer/Lecturer positions in Farm Animal Science (ref 16439)

Bristol University's Veterinary School is seeking to recruit two Senior Lecturers/Lecturers to join a new dynamic team of Farm Animal academics. One of the School's main strategic objectives is to become recognised as a leader in providing enlightened training for the next generation of farm animal veterinarians and in advancing knowledge relating to production animal health and welfare.

Candidates will be recognised experts in an aspect of production animal science and have experience of undergraduate and post graduate teaching. Ideally, the appointee will have a PhD and be expected to have a track record of publication in peer reviewed journals and to develop a research programme. However, applications from candidates with limited research experience will be considered.

You must hold a veterinary qualification that is recognised by the RCVS and allows you to practise veterinary medicine within the UK.

The level of the tenure track appointments will be made according to qualifications and experience. It is anticipated that interviews will be held in late August 2011.

Senior Clinical Training Scholarship - Resident in Bovine Health Management (ref SCH/11/08)
